On April 17th, from 9 am to 3 pm, the Public Works Department located at 4200 Fewell Drive will be accepting items for recycling and/or disposal. During this time, we will also be collecting items that will be donated to Arc of Greater Tarrant County (Association of Retarded Citizens).

Before a drop off can be accepted proof of Lake Worth residency will be required.

Proof of residency may be shown in the form of a previous month's water bill and/or by drivers' license.

Disposal Items

- Bagged Leaves
- General Trash
- Tree Limbs

(Please note that items with CFCs (chlorinated Fluorocarbons) will not be accepted unless you supply a certificate from a certified technician that CFCs has been removed.)

Donations Accepted

- Apparel (greatly needed)
- Furniture (no sleeper couches)
- Dishes
- Small Kitchen Appliances
- Cell Phones
- Computers
- Television (no larger than 32 inches)

Unacceptable Items: Hot Ashes, Liquids such as motor oils or grease, hazardous materials such as car batteries or lead based paints, and/or tires.
