Summary:

State law regarding the Crime Control and Prevention District (CCPD) requires the District's Board to hold a public hearing prior to the adoption of the budget.

The notice of this public hearing was published in the Star Telegram newspaper in accordance with State law. The public hearing for the FY 2018/2019 Crime Control and Prevention District budget was advertised for 5:00 p.m., July 10, 2018 with final adoption and public hearing on August 14th at 6:30 p.m.

The proposed budget for FY 2018/2019 is \$1,099,827 in revenues and \$1,097,590 in expenses.

- The proposed FY 2018/2019 budget results in a surplus of \$2,237
- Major changes in expenses in the proposed budget are the following:
 - The CCPD budget has taken on more of the expense for training, travel & lodging, training supplies and uniforms;
 - o CCPD Special Election expense;
 - Citizen Police Academy supplies and equipment. This is a new line item to assist with support of the CPA for new uniforms and equipment.
 - Staff will be proposing in increase to the TMRS (Texas Municipal Retirement System) contribution starting FY 2018/2019. The current rate is 6%, 2:1 match with a proposed increase of 7% 2:1 match. The amount from CCPD needed to fund this increase is \$14,475 which has been added to the proposed budget. If the increase of TMRS is not approved city-wide by the Council this expense will be removed and reflected as a surplus.
 - No capital equipment has been included in the proposed budget, however there is a need for two (2) CID unmarked vehicles. The cost for the two (2) vehicles is not to exceed \$60,000. The budget currently reflects a surplus f \$2,237; therefore, use of prior year fund balance would be required to purchase the vehicles. This item is at the discretion of the CCPD board and City Council.
 - The budget includes funding for the following nine (9) positions:
 Detective (1), Patrol Officers (4), Patrol Officer-Community Liaison (1), School Resource Officer (1), Professional Standards Officer (1), Telecommunicator (1)

CITY OF LAKE WORTH CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FYE SEPTEMBER 30, 2018

REVENUES

Budgeted sales tax represents a 2% increase over the estimated total revenue for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018. Proposed revenue totals \$1,099,827 for FY 2018/2019.

EXPENSES

Proposed Expenses total \$1,097,590 for FY 2018/2019.

- Major changes in expenses in the proposed budget are the following:
 - The CCPD budget has taken on more of the expense for training, travel & lodging, training supplies and uniforms;
 - CCPD Special Election expense;
 - Citizen Police Academy supplies and equipment. This is a new line item to assist with support of the CPA for new uniforms and equipment.
 - Staff will be proposing an increase to the TMRS (Texas Municipal Retirement System) contribution starting FY 2018/2019, with an effective date of January 1, 2019. The current rate is 6%, 2:1 match with a proposed increase of 7%, 2:1 match. The amount from CCPD needed to fund this increase is \$14,475 which has been added to the proposed budget. If the increase of TMRS is not approved city-wide by the Council, this expense will be removed and reflected as a surplus.
 - No capital equipment has been included in the proposed budget, however there is a need for two (2) CID unmarked vehicles. The cost for the two (2) vehicles is not to exceed \$60,000. The budget currently reflects a surplus of \$2,237; therefore, use of prior year fund balance would be required to purchase the vehicles. Purchase of these vehicles is at the discretion of the CCPD board and City Council. **See Fund Balance Analysis attached**

C. GENERAL ITEMS

C.1 DISCUSS AND CONSIDER THE PURCHASE OF A 2018 FORD TAURUS SEDAN FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$30,000.

Police Chief Corry Blount presented the item. After a review of the Police Department's patrol and unmarked fleet, it was determined that the vehicle assigned to the Chief of Police was no longer serviceable and has exceeded the requirements of the proposed Vehicle Replacement Policy. The current funded vehicle is a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria that has 152,000+ miles and has exceeded its useful life. The Police Department would like to request its replacement. Chief Blount stated that vehicle would be used to attend meetings, citizen outreach and emergencies that require his presence. The vehicle would be a take home vehicle and he would discontinue his car allowance.

Council member Smith asked about the purchase of gasoline to and from his residence. Chief Blount stated that the city would supply approximately 70% and he would supply the rest.

Council member Hill commented that during the interviews for a Police Chief the Council had discussed the topic and decided to pay a car allowance in lieu of a city vehicle.

Other questions from Council included the distance to and from work, response time if an emergency arose, the current policy on limited miles for take home vehicles and concerns for future replacement vehicles.

BOARD MEMBER FERGUSON MADE A MOTION, SECONDED BY BOARD MEMBER WHITE, TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF A VEHICLE NOT TO EXCEED \$30,000.

APPROVED 5-3, WITH BOARD MEMBERS FERGUSON, WHITE, STUARD, NARMORE AND PRESIDENT BOWEN VOTING IN FAVOR AND BOARD MEMBERS SMITH, PARSLEY AND HILL VOTING AGAINST.

Item: Public Hearing on the Crime Control and Prevention District proposed FY

2018/2019 budget and authorize adoption.

Summary:

State law regarding the Crime Control and Prevention District (CCPD) requires the District's Board to hold a public hearing prior to the adoption of the budget.

The notice of this public hearing was published in the Star Telegram newspaper in accordance with State law. The public hearing for the FY 2018/2019 Crime Control and Prevention District budget was advertised for 5:00 p.m., July 10, 2018 with final adoption and public hearing on August 14th at 6:30 p.m..

The proposed FY 2018/2019 Crime Control and Prevention District annual budget was reviewed by the Crime Control Board at a workshop held on July 10, 2018.

The proposed budget for FY 2018/2019 is \$1,099,827 in revenues and \$1,097,590 in expenses.

- The proposed FY 2018/2019 budget results in a surplus of \$2,237
- Major changes in expenses in the proposed budget are the following:
 - The CCPD budget has taken on more of the expense for training, travel & lodging, training supplies and uniforms;
 - CCPD Special Election expense;
 - Citizen Police Academy supplies and equipment. This is a new line item to assist with support of the CPA for new uniforms and equipment.
 - Staff will be proposing in increase to the TMRS (Texas Municipal Retirement System) contribution starting FY 2018/2019. The current rate is 6%, 2:1 match with a proposed increase of 7% 2:1 match. The amount from CCPD needed to fund this increase is \$14,475 which has been added to the proposed budget. If the increase of TMRS is not approved city-wide by the Council this expense will be removed and reflected as a surplus.
 - No capital equipment has been included in the proposed budget, however there is a need for two (2) CID unmarked vehicles. The cost for the two (2) vehicles is not to exceed \$60,000. The budget currently reflects a surplus f \$2,237; therefore, use of prior year fund balance would be required to purchase the vehicles. This item is at the discretion of the CCPD board and City Council.
 - The budget includes funding for the following nine (9) positions:
 Detective (1), Patrol Officers (4), Patrol Officer-Community Liaison (1), School Resource Officer (1), Professional Standards Officer (1), Telecommunicator (1)

The revised budget for FY 2017/2018 is \$1,078,412 revenues and \$1,111,678 expenses. Summary and detailed reports are attached for your review.

Item: Discuss and consider recommending City Council approval of Ordinance No. 1115,

Summary:

After a mid-year budget review, staff is recommending a reduction in budgeted Sales Tax revenue for FY 2017/2018. The original budget was \$1,075,000 and the actual amount is now estimated to be \$1,025,000. Due to minor estimated increases in other revenues, line item transfers have been recorded to reduce the Sales Tax revenue budget to \$1,067,448 (reduced by \$7,552), leaving the requested budget amendment amount at \$42,448. In addition, the budget amendment includes an increase in Use of Prior Year Assigned Fund Balance in the amount of \$2,950. This amount represents CCPD net auction proceeds from March 2017 that will be transferred to the General Fund for use to build a new City storage facility.

Fiscal Impact:

Net decrease in CCPD budgeted revenues in the amount of \$39,498.

ORDINANCE NO. 1115

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LAKE WORTH, TEXAS, ADOPTING A BUDGET AMENDMENT TO THE ORIGINAL OPERATING BUDGET OF THE CITY OF LAKE WORTH, TEXAS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2017/2018; PROVIDING FOR SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION AND/OR TRANSFER OF CERTAIN FUNDS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 1093, the City Council of the City of Lake Worth, Texas, adopted its budget for FY 2017/2018; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the budget for the Crime Control & Prevention District (CCPD) requires amendment to reflect a net reduction in revenues; and

WHEREAS, Section 102.010 of the Local Government Code and Section 5.01 of the Lake Worth City Charter allow the City Council to make changes to the budget for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to amend Ordinance No.1093 to reflect a supplemental appropriation and/or transfer in the fiscal year 2017/2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKE WORTH, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: The original CCPD operating budget for FY 2017/2018 for the City of Lake Worth, Texas is hereby amended as follows:

ADD:

\$2,950 to CCPD Revenues

#108-4996-000-000 Use of Prior Year Assigned Fund Balance

\$ 2,950

SUBTRACT:

\$42,448 from CCPD Revenues

#108-4011-000-000 State Sales Tax

\$ 42,448

Reason (pursuant Section 5.01(e) of the City Charter, as amended):
The budget amendment for CCPD is necessary to reflect a net reduction in budgeted revenue based on mid-year budget review projections.

SECTION 2: A true and correct copy of this ordinance showing the approved budget amendments shall be filed with the City Secretary and in the office of the County Clerk of Tarrant County, Texas, as required by Section 102.009 of the Local Government Code. In addition, the City Secretary is hereby directed to ensure that a true and correct copy of the approved budget amendment is posted on the City's website.

SECTION 3: In the event any clause, phrase, provision, sentence, or part of this ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Lake Worth, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, and it is so ordained.

Item: Discuss and consider the reallocation of funds from the jailboard project to

purchase an in-car video system as well as repair and relocate the jail board during

the remodel of the dispatch area.

Summary:

Staff recommends the reallocation of funds (\$90,000.00) that were allocated to purchase a new jailboard during the 2017-2018 budget process. The funds would be used to purchase new in-car video systems (Watch Guard) including body cameras for seven (7) vehicles and to relocate the current jail board during the dispatch remodel.

General Discussion:

The City of Lake Worth Police Department currently relies on an aging Data 9-1-1 in-car video system that is used in conjunction with a handheld digital voice recorder. These older systems combine both mobile-video and mobile-data computer functions. The new in-car video system would replace the aging Data 9-1-1 system with fully digital HD mobile video systems manufactured by Watch Guard, located in Allen, Texas. These new systems include HD body worn cameras that sync individually with the patrol vehicle. These body cameras will add to the cameras purchased through a CJD Grant that was recently approved. This will allow an individual body worn camera to be issued to all police personnel as well as provide spares.

In addition, by separating the mobile data computer and mobile video functions, we ensure that more patrol vehicles stay in service should one or the other systems require repair or service. That is currently not the case.

The integrated system would increase officer safety, properly record and store the interactions of officers and the citizens they encounter and provide proper documentation for case filing purposes.

The current layout of the dispatch area does not provide a conducive work environment. As designed, the current space is cramped, inefficient and wastes a great deal of otherwise usable space. It also does not provide much in the way of space for storage. An open design will allow a better, more productive space for communications employees and make better use of the space allowed.

Current Jailboard funding: 90,000.00
Total cost of new video system: 65,390.00
Repair of Jailboard: 1,415.00
Removal and relocation of Jailboard: 7,215.00

Item: Discuss and consider approval of Order No. 005, calling a Referendum to

determine whether the voters desire to continue the Crime Control and Prevention District and Sales Tax for the number of years (either 5, 10, 15, or 20

years) as determined by the CCPD Board and allowed by state law.

Summary:

The Lake Worth Crime Control and Prevention District (CCPD) was initially authorized by voters in a special election in February 2004. An election was held in November 2008 for voters to determine if the CCPD should be reauthorized for a period of ten years. That proposition passed with the CCPD set to dissolve in 2018. Chapter 363 of the Local Government Code provides that the district may be continued, or reauthorized, upon approval by Lake Worth voters. The district may be continued only for 5, 10, 15 or 20 years.

Since its inception in 2004, the Crime Control and Prevention District has generated approximately \$11.5 million through the ¼ cent sales tax to fund law enforcement services and programs. This has allowed the Police Department to:

- Fund one additional Detective position, four Police Officer positions, one School Resource officer, one Professional Standards officer and one Communications officer.
- Provide funding for three marked police vehicles and three administrative vehicles as well as their replacements over time.
- Provide co-funding to the police department General Fund budget to cover expenses related to personnel, overtime, training, supplies, equipment, uniforms and weapons.
- Maintain competitive salaries for Lake Worth police personnel.

The continuation of the Crime Control and Prevention District will allow the Police Department to continue to grow, develop and professionalize its operations. It also allows Lake Worth Police personnel to remain one of Tarrant County's best equipped police agencies. This funding is critical in maintaining our community's high level of service without raising other fees and taxes.

The CCPD will dissolve on June 30, 2019 unless it is reauthorized by voters. The proposed Order No. 005, orders a referendum election for the voters to vote on the reauthorization of the CCPD and the CCPD sales tax for ten years. The election will be held jointly with other political entities holding an election on November 6, 2018. The City will be entering into a contract with the Tarrant County Elections Administrator to administer the joint election. Lake Worth voters will be able to vote early at the Tarrant County Elections Center located at 2700 Premier, Fort Worth, and at the Tarrant County Sheriff's Office – North Patrol Division, 6651 Lake Worth Blvd., Lake Worth and other additional branch early voting locations throughout Tarrant County.

ORDER NO. <u>005</u>

AN ORDER CALLING A REFERENDUM TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE CITIZENS OF LAKE WORTH, TEXAS DESIRE TO CONTINUE THE CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT IN THE CITY OF LAKE WORTH, TEXAS FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS AND TO CONTINUE A CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT SALES TAX FOR A PERIOD OF TEN YEARS.

WHEREAS, Chapter 363, Texas Local Government Code (the "Act") provides for the creation of a crime control and prevention district ("CCPD") within a city; and

WHEREAS, in November 2003, the citizenry of the City of Lake Worth, Texas (the "City") voted to establish a crime control and prevention district within the city which was created in February 2004; and

WHEREAS, Section 363.251 authorizes the CCPD Board to hold a referendum on whether to continue the CCPD within the City; and

WHEREAS, Section 363.2515 of the Act allows a district to be continued for a period of 5, 10, 15, or 20 years; and

WHEREAS, Lake Worth CCPD Board desires to hold a referendum on whether to continue the CCPD and ¼ percent Sales Tax for a period of ten years;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE LAKE WORTH CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. REFERENDUM CALLED

A referendum shall be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, to submit to the voters a proposition to determine whether the crime control and prevention district and sales tax will be continued for a period of ten years.

SECTION 2. BALLOT

The official ballots for said referendum shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the proposition, with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such proposition to be expressed substantially as follows:

AGAINST	()	TAX SHOULD BE CONTINUED FOR TEN YEARS.

SECTION 3. JOINT ELECTION CONTRACT

The referendum shall be administered by the City of Lake Worth. The City shall contract with the Tarrant County Elections Administration to take care of all aspects of the referendum in accordance with state law. The Tarrant County Elections Administrator shall be the Early Voting Clerk. The contract shall address the Early Voting and Election Day polling places/times/dates. The Election Judge, alternate, and election workers shall be the responsibility of the Tarrant County Elections Administrator.

SECTION 4. GOVERNING LAW AND NOTICE OF REFERENDUM

The referendum shall be held in accordance with the Texas Local Government Code, Texas Election Code, and City Charter. Notice of this referendum shall be given in accordance with the governing laws.

SECTION 5. TEXAS COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

Upon adoption of this Order, the City Secretary is directed to immediately give notice of the referendum to the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, by delivering a copy of this Order via mail.

SECTION 6. SUBMISSIONS TO THE UNITED STATES JUSTICE DEPARTMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Lake Worth, the City Attorney, and/or Tarrant County Elections Administration is authorized to make such submissions as are necessary to the United States Justice Department to seek pre-clearance as required by law.

SECTION 7. NECESSARY ACTIONS

The Mayor and the City Secretary, in consultation with the City Attorney, are authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Election Code, the City Code and City Charter, and Chapter 327 of the Tax Code in carrying out and conducting the referendum, whether or not expressly authorized by this Order.

SECTION 9 ABSENCE

The City Secretary is also hereby authorized to appoint person(s) as appropriate to perform duties relating to this election in her absence in accordance with the City Charter and Section 1.007 (a-b) and 143.006 of the Texas Election Code.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Order shall be effective upon its adoption.
