Code Compliance Corner

April Showers
Bring May Flowers and High Grass & Weeds!

Just a friendly reminder the city ordinance prohibits any grass, weeds, or any plant that is not cultivated to grow to a height greater than twelve (12') inches or to grow in rank profusion (an overabundance) upon such premises, including along the sidewalk or street adjacent to the same between the property line and curb or if there is no curb, then to the edge of the roadway. Your entire property front, sides, and rear must be kept under the twelve (12') inches.

Not only are high grass and weeds unsightly, but they pose a fire hazard, block visibility for drivers, harbor rodents and snakes and contribute to pests like mosquitoes and chiggers.

Please mow your yard as frequently as necessary to remain in compliance.

Utility Billing Department

November 14 – February 14 is the time frame used to calculate the new sewer charge for residential water accounts. The new rates are effective April's water bill.

If you had a leak during this time frame and have it repaired, you will need to fill out and submit a request for re-consideration of winter sewer average. You can start submitting your request to the utility billing department now through June 30th. Your completed form should be accompanied by proof of the leak being fixed. An acceptable proof of repair includes but is not limited to: a plumber's invoice or store receipt of parts purchased.

Payment options are to pay in person, by mail, or by making a payment through nCourt online or by telephone for an additional fee. All payments received prior to 5:00 pm on a business day will be posted the same day.
