Code Compliance Corner.....

Code Compliance Initiative November 2018 Building/House Numbers Displayed

Making sure help (police, fire, ambulance, etc.) knows where to find you is very important when seconds count. Help Emergency Responders protect you and your family in the event of an emergency; by making sure your address is visible. Emergency Responders can locate you quicker when they can easily find your address.

Give your structure proper identification... By posting the address in the correct location you allow delivery services, postal services, and utility service providers to find you quicker as well. Without the address properly posted these services may not be able to find you and may even refuse service.

City Code requires that all buildings shall have address numbers, building numbers or building identification in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. The numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers should be in Arabic numbers or alphabetical letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of four (4") inches high with a minimum stroke width of one half $(\frac{1}{2}")$ inch. Where access is by means of a private road and the building address cannot be viewed from the public way, a monument, pole or other sign or means shall be used to identify the structure.

TIPS FOR DISPLAYING ADDRESSES

- House numbers should be displayed on the building itself and in a prominent and conspicuous place, so as to be legible from the street.
- All numbers should be a minimum of four (4") inches high with a minimum stroke width of one half $(\frac{1}{2})$ inch.
- When practical, the numbers should be placed near a light so that they may be readily seen at night. If the numbers are not illuminated, they should be reflective.
- The colors of the numbers should be in sharp contrast to the color of their background.
- Numbers are easier to read displayed horizontally, not vertically.
- Make sure the numbers are not blocked/covered by trees, vines, or other vegetation.







Code Compliance Initiative December 2018 House Maintenance

Routine Maintenance is crucial to keeping your home in tip top shape and proper working order. Check out the Fall Maintenance Checklist below for tips on proper maintenance:

- 1. Roof: Check the roof and around vents, skylights, and chimneys for leaks. Repair as necessary.
- 2. Attic: If there is no ridge vent, keep gable vents open year-round to ensure proper ventilation.

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3. Gutters: Clean the gutters and drain pipes so leaves won't clog them and be sure they drain away from the house.

(Fall: In cold-climate areas) Drain outside faucets.

- **4. Fireplace:** Clean the fireplace of ashes. (Fall) Check the chimney for loose or missing mortar. Have the chimney professionally cleaned. Make sure the damper closes tightly. (Spring) Leave the damper open for improved ventilation if the home is not air-conditioned.
- 5. Filters: Remember to clean or replace filters once a month, or as needed. Check and clean the dryer vent, air conditioner, stove hood, and room fans. Keep heating and cooling vents clean and free from furniture and draperies.
- **6. Safety Equipment:** Ensure that all smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and fire extinguishers are in good working order. Replace batteries in appropriate devices as needed, or at least twice each year.
- 7. Air Conditioner: (Fall: In cold-climate areas) Remove window air-conditioners or put weatherproof covers on them.
- 8. Refrigerator: Make sure your refrigerator door seals are airtight. Test them by closing the door over a dollar bill. If you can pull the bill out easily, the latch may need to be adjusted or the seal may need to be replaced. In addition, if you have a coil-back refrigerator, vacuum the coils at least twice each year. Your refrigerator will run more efficiently with clean coils. Also, stock up! A full refrigerator uses less energy than an empty one.
- Faucets: Check for leaky faucets in the kitchen and bathroom(s). Replace washers as necessary.
- 10. Windows and Doors: Seal drafty doors and windows. If you added up all of the small cracks where heating and cooling escapes from a home, it would be the same as having a window open. Replace seals as needed.
- 11. Storm Windows and Screens: (Fall) Take down screens (if removable type) and replace with storm windows. (Spring) Remove, clean, and store storm windows (if removable). Check and patch all door and window screens. Put screens up (if removable type).
- 12. Siding and Paint: Look for cracks and holes in house siding or paint. Replace caulk if necessary. A carpet knife can work well for cutting away old caulking from house siding. Slice down alongside it from both directions with the hook-

like blade, then use the knife to lift out the old caulk bead intact.

14. Heating System: (Fall) Have the heating system serviced. Change filters.

15. Hot Water Heater: (Fall) Drain the hot water heater. Remove sediment from the bottom of the tank.

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Protect yourself

Protect Your Drains

When you have finished cooking, collect liquid grease and oils in a sealable container. For the grease that cannot be poured into a container, you should wipe clean with a paper towel and put it in the trash. Food scraps should also go in the trash. Scrape off excess food from pits, pans, and plates before rinsing them in the sink with cold water.

DO put oil and grease in covered collections containers.

DO scrape food scraps from dishes into trash cans and garbage bags and dispose of properly. Avoid using the garbage disposal.

DO remove oil and grease from dishes, pans, fryers, and griddles. Cool first before you skim, scrape, or wipe off excess grease.

DON'T pour oil and grease down the drain.

DON'T put food scraps down the drain.

DON'T rinse off oil and grease with hot water.

Municipal Munchies

FLUFFY FRUIT SALAD

2 cans (20 ounces each) crushed pineapple

2/3 cup sugar

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

2 eggs, lightly beaten

1/4 cup orange juice

3 tablespoons lemon juice

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

2 cans (17 ounces each) fruit cocktail, drained

2 cans (11 ounces each) mandarin oranges, drained

1 small jar maraschino cherries, drained and cut up

2 cups heavy cream, whipped

2-3 bananas, sliced

1 green apple, peeled and diced

4-5 ounces cool whip



Drain pineapple, reserving 1 cup juice in a small saucepan. Set pineapple aside. To saucepan add sugar, flour, eggs, orange juice, lemon juice and oil. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Boil for one minute; remove from the heat and let cool. In a salad bowl, combine pineapple, fruit cocktail, oranges and cherries. Fold in whipped cream and cooled sauce. Chill for several hours. Just before serving add bananas, apples and cool whip.

Just a reminder...

November 14 – February 14 is the time frame used to calculate the new sewer charge for residential water accounts. The new rates are effective April 2019 water bill.

If you have a leak during this time frame and have it repaired, you will need to fill out and submit a request for re-consideration of winter sewer average. Your completed form should be accompanied by proof of the leak being fixed. An acceptable proof of repair includes but is not limited to: a plumber's invoice or store receipt of parts purchased.


