





NOVEMBER 2019 CODE COMPLIANCE INITIATIVE BUILDING/HOUSE NUMBERS DISPLAYED

Making sure help (police, fire, ambulance, etc.) knows where to find you is very important when seconds count. Help Emergency Responders protect you and your family in the event of an emergency; by making sure your address is visible. Emergency Responders can locate you quicker when they can easily find your address.




Give your structure proper identification... By posting the address in the correct location you allow delivery services, postal services, and utility service providers to find you quicker as well. Without the address properly posted these services may not be able to find you and may even refuse service.

City Code requires that all buildings shall have address numbers, building numbers or building identification on the structure itself in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. The numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers should be in Arabic numbers or alphabetical letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of four (4") inches high with a minimum stroke width of one half $(\frac{1}{2}")$ inch. Where access is by means of a private road and the building address cannot be viewed from the public way, a monument, pole or other sign or means shall be used to identify the structure.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR DISPLAYING ADDRESSES

- House numbers should be displayed on the building itself and in a prominent and conspicuous place, so as to be legible from the street.
- All numbers should be a minimum of four (4") inches high with a minimum stroke width of one half (½") inch.
- When practical, the numbers should be placed near a light so that they may be readily seen at night. If the numbers are not illuminated, they should be reflective.
- The colors of the numbers should be in sharp contrast to the color of their background.
- Numbers are easier to read displayed horizontally, not vertically.
- Make sure the numbers are not blocked/covered by trees, vines, or other vegetation.









DECEMBER 2019 – CODE COMPLIANCE INITIATIVE

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

Routine Maintenance is crucial to keeping your home in tip top shape and proper working order. Review the Fall Maintenance Checklist below for tips on proper maintenance:

- **1. Roof:** Check the roof and around vents, skylights, and chimneys for leaks. Repair as necessary.
- **2. Attic:** If there is no ridge vent, keep gable vents open year-round to ensure proper ventilation.



- **4. Fireplace:** Clean the fireplace of ashes. (Fall) <u>Check the chimney for loose or missing mortar</u>. Have the chimney professionally cleaned. Make sure the damper closes tightly. (Spring) Leave the damper open for improved ventilation if the home is not air-conditioned.
- **5. Filters:** Remember to clean or replace filters once a month, or as needed. Check and clean the dryer vent, air conditioner, stove hood, and room fans. Keep heating and cooling vents clean and free from furniture and draperies.
- **6. Safety Equipment:** Ensure that all smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, and fire extinguishers are in good working order. Replace batteries in appropriate devices as needed, or at least twice each year.
- **7. Air Conditioner:** (Fall: In cold-climate areas) Remove window air-conditioners or put weatherproof covers on them.
- **8. Refrigerator**: Make sure your refrigerator door seals are airtight. Test them by closing the door over a dollar bill. If you can pull the bill out easily, the latch may need to be adjusted or the seal may need to be replaced. In addition, if you have a coil-back refrigerator, vacuum the coils at least twice each year. Your refrigerator will run more efficiently with clean coils. Also, stock up! A full refrigerator uses less energy than an empty one.
- 9. Faucets: Check for leaky faucets in the kitchen and bathroom(s). Replace washers as necessary.
- **10. Windows and Doors:** Seal drafty doors and windows. If you added up all of the small cracks where heating and cooling escapes from a home, it would be the same as having a window open. Replace seals as needed.
- **11. Storm Windows and Screens:** (Fall) Take down screens (if removable type) and replace with storm windows. (Spring) Remove, clean, and store storm windows (if removable). Check and patch all door and window screens. Put screens up (if removable type).
- **12. Siding and Paint:** Look for cracks and holes in house siding or paint. Replace caulk if necessary. A carpet knife can work well for cutting away old caulking from house siding. Slice down alongside it from both directions with the hook-like blade, then use the knife to lift out the old caulk bead intact.
- 14. Heating System: (Fall) Have the heating system serviced. Change filters.
- 15. Hot Water Heater: (Fall) Drain the hot water heater. Remove sediment from the bottom of the tank.

Tarrant County Donates 12 Acres for Texas State Veterans Home

On August 6, 2019, Tarrant County Commissioners unanimously approved the donation of 12 acres of land to the Texas Veterans Land Board for the purpose of operating a skilled nursing facility benefitting our Texas Veterans.



The Veterans Land Board in the Texas General Land Office operates the Texas State Veterans Homes serving veterans who are over 65 and in need of affordable skilled nursing home care who have a service-connected disability. Currently there are only nine other similar facilities throughout the State.

With approximately 84,000 veterans 65 years of age and older living in Dallas and Tarrant Counties, this much needed 120 bed skilled-nursing facility will serve our qualified veterans in and around Tarrant County. "The county will benefit from this facility because it will allow a loved one to stay closer to their home since other state Veterans' homes are not located near north Texas and are spread throughout the state," Thomas Bel- ton III, Director of Tarrant County Veterans Services stated.

The design phase has begun on the new facility which will be conveniently located next to the Veterans hospital and Tarrant County Resource Connection where Tarrant County Veterans Services is located.

You may be eligible for alternative ways to payment, such as community service or a reduction in the fine amount.

MUNICIPAL MUNCHIES

HONEY PECAN TRIANGLES

2 teaspoons plus ½ cup butter, softened, divided

½ cup packed brown sugar

1 large egg yolk, room temperature

1 ½ cups all-purpose flour

TOPPING:

- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- ½ cup butter, cubed
- 1/4 cup honey
- ½ cup heavy whipping cream
- 4 cups chopped pecans

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 13 x 9 baking pan with foil, letting ends extend up sides; grease foil with 2 teaspoons butter. In a large bowl, cream remaining butter & brown sugar until light & fluffy; beat in egg yolk. Gradually beat in flour. Pressinto prepared pan. Bake until golden brown, about 15 minutes. Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, combine brown sugar, butter & honey. Bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring constantly; cook & stir for 3 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in cream & pecans. Pour over crust. Bake until hot & bubbly, about 30 minutes. Cool completely on a wire rack. Lifting with foil, remove from pan. Cut into 24 squares. Cut squares diagonally into triangles.

Yield: 4 dozen

Just a reminder...

November 7 – February 7 is the time frame used to calculate the new sewer charge for residential
water accounts. The new rates are effective April 2020 water bill.

If you had a leak during this time frame and had it repaired, you will need to fill out and submit a request for re-consideration of winter sewer average. Your completed form should be accompanied by proof of the leak being fixed. An acceptable proof of repair includes but is not limited to: a plumber's invoice or store receipt of parts purchased.

SROs cannot give legal advice, but they can help explain the legal system and offer tips on how to navigate it Most of the time, SROs serve as informal counselors and mentors rather than law enforcement officers.




