

On September 25, 2021 the Lake Worth Police Department became a "Recognized Law Enforcement Agency" by the Texas Law Enforcement Best Practices Recognition Program; the 183rd agency in Texas to be so recognized. The Lake Worth Police Department considers itself one of the premier law enforcement agencies in the state, and this achievement is one of many that affirms as much.

The Texas Law Enforcement Best Practice Recognition Program was created in 2006 as a voluntary program whereby police agencies in Texas demonstrate their compliance with 170 Texas law enforcement best practices. All the program's best practices were carefully developed by Texas law enforcement professionals to assist agencies in the effective delivery of service, reduction of risk and the protection of individuals' civil rights.

In September of 2019, the Lake Worth Police Department began a ground-up reconstruction of its internal processes using the best practices recognition program as a model. After writing more than 550 pages of policy and undergoing rigorous third-party audits, a final on-site assessment was conducted on September 8-9, 2021. The department earned high praise from its assessors, and their findings were forwarded to the Texas Police Chiefs Association's Recognition Committee for final analysis and consideration.

This process provided an independent review of the department's internal operations and should assure the citizens and visitors of Lake Worth that the Lake Worth Police Department adheres to the highest law enforcement standards.

Animal Services Information:

- All domestic pets (dogs, cats, and ferrets) over four (4) months of age must be currently rabies vaccinated and registered yearly with the City. Animal tags can be obtained at City Hall, 3805 Adam Grubb.
- All livestock including horses, sheep, goats, cattle, and pigs (swine) are not permitted in City limits.
- Roosters, ducks, geese, guinea fowl, and turkeys are not permitted in City limits.
- Six (6) hens (female chickens) are permitted in an adequate fowl shelter, with annual inspections and the required hen permit.

Safe Harbor Initiative

Anyone who has outstanding warrants with the Lake Worth Municipal Court is urged to appear at the court office to resolve their outstanding charges. Defendants that appear in the court office *will not be arrested* for outstanding warrants issued by the Lake Worth Municipal Court. You may be eligible for alternative ways to payment, such as community service or a reduction in the fine amount. Your warrants will be recalled, and you will be scheduled to see the Judge to discuss your situation. NEW RATES EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2021

Changes to residential & commercial accounts

Stormwater Utility Fee

Single-family property fees. Residential properties shall be measured as one equivalent residential unit (ERU) per month, regardless of the actual amount of impervious cover on such properties. Each benefiting residential property shall be assessed a fee of \$2.00 per month.

(b) Non-single-family property fees. Stormwater utility fees for nonresidential property, excluding Lake Worth Independent School District property, shall be calculated for each benefited property using the impervious area in square feet (SF) at the following rate:

Fee = Allocated impervious area on the parcel(s) in square feet (SF) X \$0.00054/SF/month.

*SF = Allocated impervious area on the parcel(s) in square feet.

Winter Sewer Average

November 7 – February 7 is the time frame used to calculate the new sewer charge for residential water accounts. The new rates are effective April 2022 water bill.

If you have a leak during this time frame and have it repaired, you will need to fill out and submit a request for re-consideration of winter sewer average. Your completed form should be accompanied by proof of the leak being fixed. An acceptable proof of repair includes but is not limited to; a plumber's invoice or store receipt of parts purchased.

Payment options are to pay in person, by mail, or by making a payment through nCourt online or by telephone for an additional fee. All payments received prior to 5:00 pm on a business day will be posted the same day.


