Municipal Munchies

Keto Creamy Chicken, Bacon and Cauliflower Bake

Ingredients:

- 1TBSP Olive oil
- 2 TBSP Butter
- 1 TBSP Minced garlic
- 1 Small cauliflower trimmed & cut into bite sized florets
- 3 Slices of bacon cut into strips
- 1 Bunch of chopped spinach
- 1/2 Cup of heavy whipping cream
- 2 TSP thyme
- 2 Shallots or green onions
- 6 Boneless chicken thighs
- 1/2 Cup cheese
- Salt & pepper to taste



Directions:

- *Heat oven 350 degrees & prepare and grease 9X13 baking dish
- *In a large pan, heat olive oil and butter. Once melted, add cauliflower and bacon. Cook for approximately 8 to 10 minutes until lightly brown.
- *Add spinach to the pan. Cook stirring for about 2 minutes. Remove from heat then add heavy whipping cream, thyme, and half of the onions. Combine together then transfer to prepared dish.
- * In that same pan, spray oil or add butter then add chicken. Season with salt and pepper. Brown on both sides for approximately 2 minutes.
- *Transfer chicken into the pan with the cauliflower mixture. Sprinkle cheese on top.
- *Bake for 20- 30 minutes or until golden brown. Stand for 5 minutes. Top with the remaining onions.

What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is rain that falls on roofs or paved area like driveways and roads. It picks up chemicals and materials that are not naturally found in our waterways ie. fertilizers, cigarette butts, leaves, oil, soaps, etc. and carries them directly into the surrounding lakes and rivers. Stormwater is separate from the sewage system, unlike wastewater, rainwater is not treated, and flows directly into the bodies of water that we use for swimming, fishing, and those that provide drinking water. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water.

What's the Problem?

Rain washes pollutants from the streets and construction sites into storm sewers and ditches. Eventually, the polluted water from these systems gets washed into streams and rivers with no treatment. This problem is known as stormwater pollution.

Stormwater pollution can have many adverse effects on creeks, rivers, lakes, and water supplies as well as plants, fish, animals, and people.

What can you do to help?

Many routines activities that you perform at home can have significant negative impacts on our stormwater system. Through some of these simple at home measures, you can help protect our natural resources.

- Sweep your gutters and driveways instead of hosing them down
- Put leaves in the compost or the garden as mulch
- Use commercial carwashes instead of washing your car in your driveway
- Have routine maintenance performed on your cars to prevent leaks and properly dispose of fluids
- Clean up pet waste
- Use chemical pesticides as a last resort, know your pest, and narrowly target it
- Do not apply fertilizers in excess or if rain is forecasted
- Plant grass where soil is exposed and enclose your garden beds to contain soil and other substances
- Properly dispose of hazardous household products



Fees will go into effect October 1, 2021

a. Single Family Property Fees. Residential properties shall be measured as one Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) per month. Regardless of the actual amount of impervious cover on such properties. Each benefiting residential property shall be assessed a fee of \$2.00 per month.

b. Non-Single-Family Property Fees. Stormwater utility fees for non-residential property, excluding Lake Worth Independent School District property, shall be calculated for each benefited property using the impervious are in square feet (SF) at the following rate:

Fee - Allocated Impervious Area on the Parcel(s) in square feet (SF) X (\$0.00057/SF/month.)





Animal Services Information:

- All domestic pets (dogs, cats, and ferrets) over four (4) months of age must be currently rabies vaccinated and registered yearly with the City. Animal tags can be obtained at City Hall, 3805 Adam Grubb.
- All livestock including horses, sheep, goats, cattle, and pigs (swine) are not permitted in City limits.
- Roosters, ducks, geese, guinea fowl, and turkeys are not permitted in City limits.
- Six (6) hens (female chickens) are permitted in an adequate fowl shelter, with annual inspections and the required hen permit.

Safe Harbor Initiative

Anyone who has outstanding warrants with the Lake Worth Municipal Court is urged to appear at the court office to resolve their outstanding charges. Defendants that appear in the court office will not be arrested for outstanding warrants issued by the Lake Worth Municipal Court. You may be eligible for alternative ways to payment, such as community service or a reduction in the fine amount. Your warrants will be recalled, and you will be scheduled to see the Judge to discuss your situation.
